

DYING FOR AN "A"

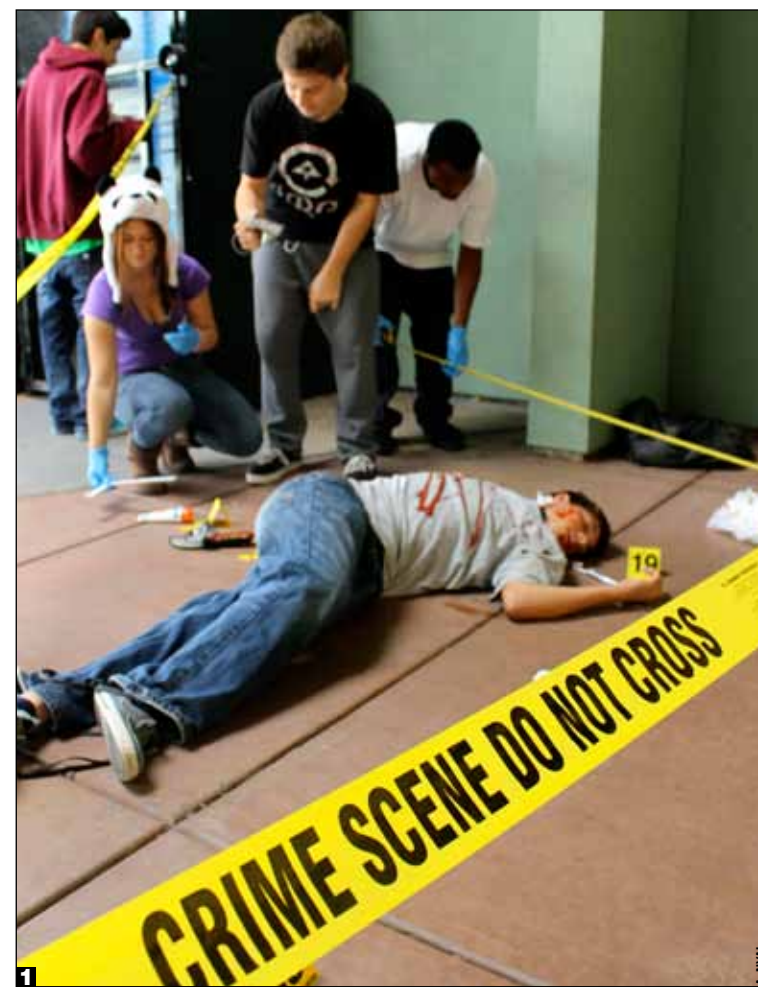
1: During Ms. Laura Brun's sixth period forensics class, Shelby Taylor, Halen Teranna and Corey Bell investigate the mock murder of Joseph Stewart while he pretends to be dead with ketchup to signify blood. Students got into groups of four and were assigned a job as either a photographer, observer, evidence collector or team leader. Each group was paired with another group who set up the crime scene they investigated. Every group had to investigate the crime scene to determine how the mock crime was committed and who was responsible. Once the cause of the "murder" was determined, they used buckets of water to clean up the ketchup used for fake blood.

2: On Oct. 7, Rochelle Stone follows the steps on her worksheet to investigate the crime scene. "Our job was to one day set up a crime scene and on the second day we had to collect evidence from another crime scene. We had to capture pictures of all the evidence, put on gloves and collect all the evidence in paper bags as professionally as possible. The whole point of the unit was to learn how to properly bag and label all the evidence just as crime scene investigators. Forensics is my favorite class this year because it keeps you on your toes at all times," Stone said.

3: Outside the dance room, Ayda Sadeghian plays "dead" at the crime scene to be investigated. "When Jennifer Golditch, Haley Doyle and Angelica Carpio were setting up the scene, Amanda Cruz was smearing dark eye shadow and eyeliner on my face to show the tennis racquet strings. In the crime scene, I was killed by being beaten in the face with it. We tied a scarf around my neck because I was also strangled. I laid out by the dance room and there were a lot of people commenting and trying to talk to me, and as much as I tried to keep silent, because I was supposed to be 'dead' it was hard and I kept laughing!" Sadeghian said.

IN first period chemistry class, Pranab Wangle places a stick across the Bunsen burner. The lab taught how fireworks obtain their color and which chemicals produce what colors. "My favorite part of this activity was seeing all of the different colors that are in the environment. We all had the chance to observe the different colors," Wangle said.

PLACING the stick into the solution, Ryan O'Malley works with his lab group. "We were working with our classmates on how elements emit certain colors and patterns of light when they're heated. The light is from the configuration of electrons in the atom. Overall, it was a very enjoyable lab, and I learned a lot from it," O'Malley said.

DURING the firework lab, Desiree Jaykins puts her stick in a flame to see what color the fire would turn. "Seeing the beautiful colors come from simple chemicals when added to fire makes me wanna go to Disneyland," Jaykins said. The experiment gave the students an understanding of how colors in fireworks occur.

AT a lab station, students examine the color of the flame as a reaction to certain chemicals. "I noticed a few different shades of purple, some greens and a couple of reds as well. I really enjoyed this lab because I was able to move around and interact with students instead of being stuck in a seat to take notes," Joseph Kiefer said.

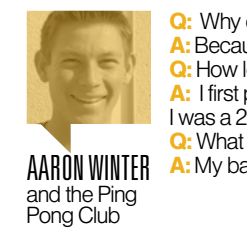
10.14 FROM TACKLES TO TRUMPET
