Gutierrez began writing at a very young age and was most inspired by his favorite author, Stephen King. Gutierrez believes that King provides an alluring thrill in all of his books which grabs the reader's attention, and allows readers to relate back to the subjects implemented in King's works.

Gutierrez has written plenty of short-stories but has yet to publish them online. However, he often shares his stories with his close friends who are entertained by his unique storytelling. Gutierrez also does not expect to receive any feedback

from his friends or family, he simply writes for enjoyment. His friends are most impressed with his stories, which brings the whole piece together.

"They like them, I don't ask them for feedback. My drawings wouldn't be a big costume it would be more like a normal dude doing normal stuff. It's not blown out of proportion and it's more of what people can relate to," Gutierrez said.

He continues to write in hopes of becoming an English major after he graduates from high school. Writing has influenced his life and has made him love what he does even more. Publishing online will give his work more recognition and may expand to other publishers who may take interest in his short stories as well.

I go to school on Saturdays and spend five hours studying, an hour every night.

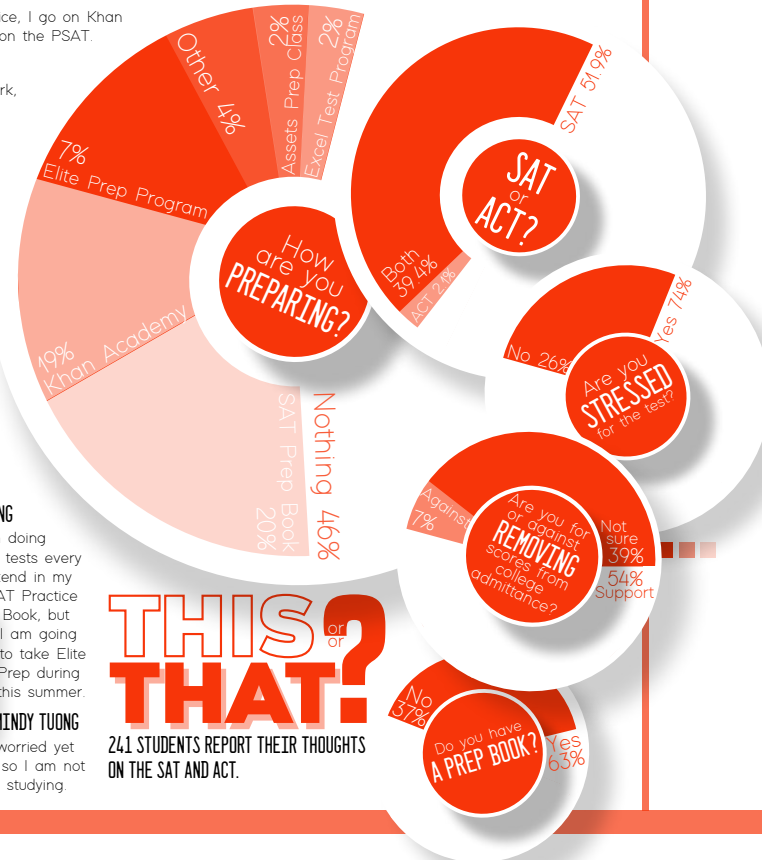
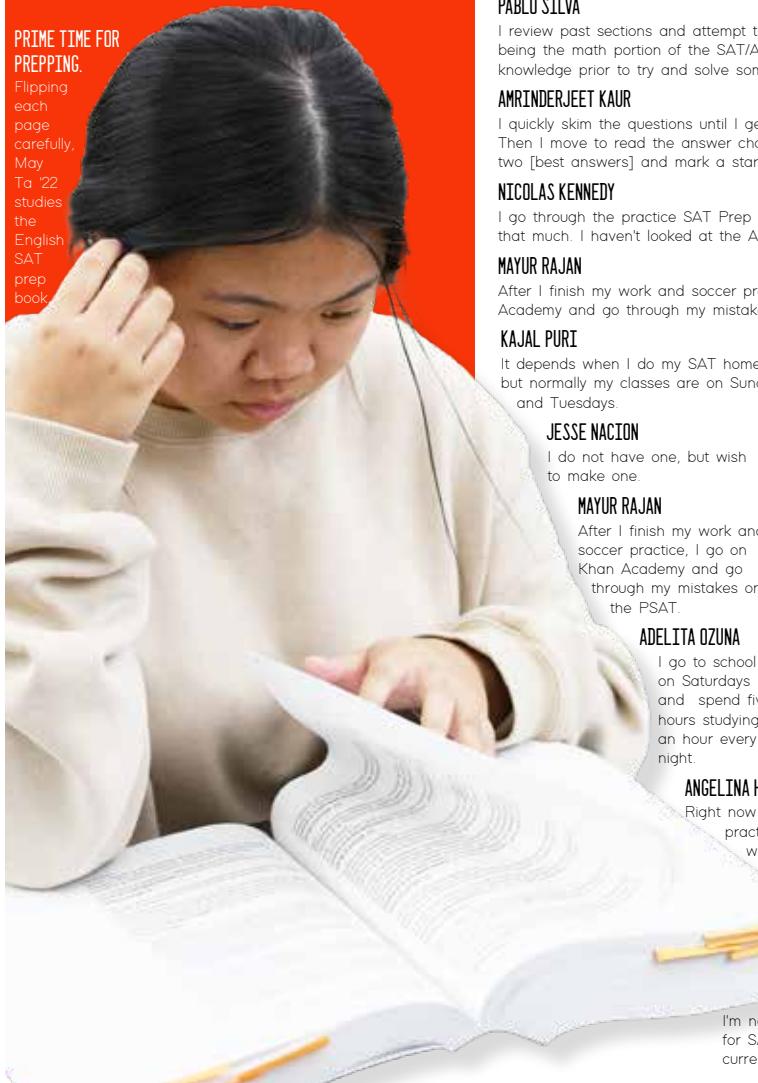
ANGELINA HOANG
