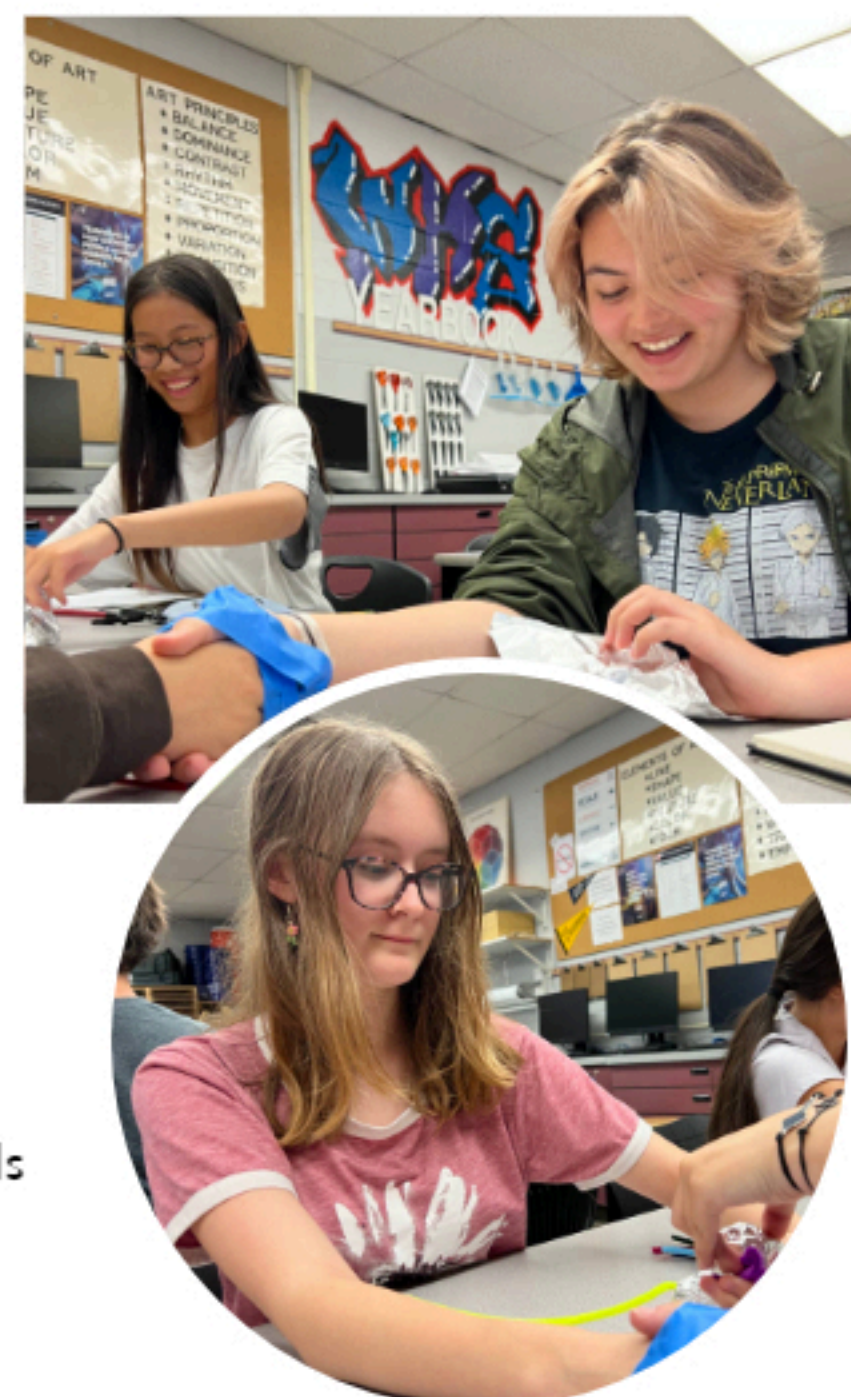
TAPED TEAMWORK TALENT

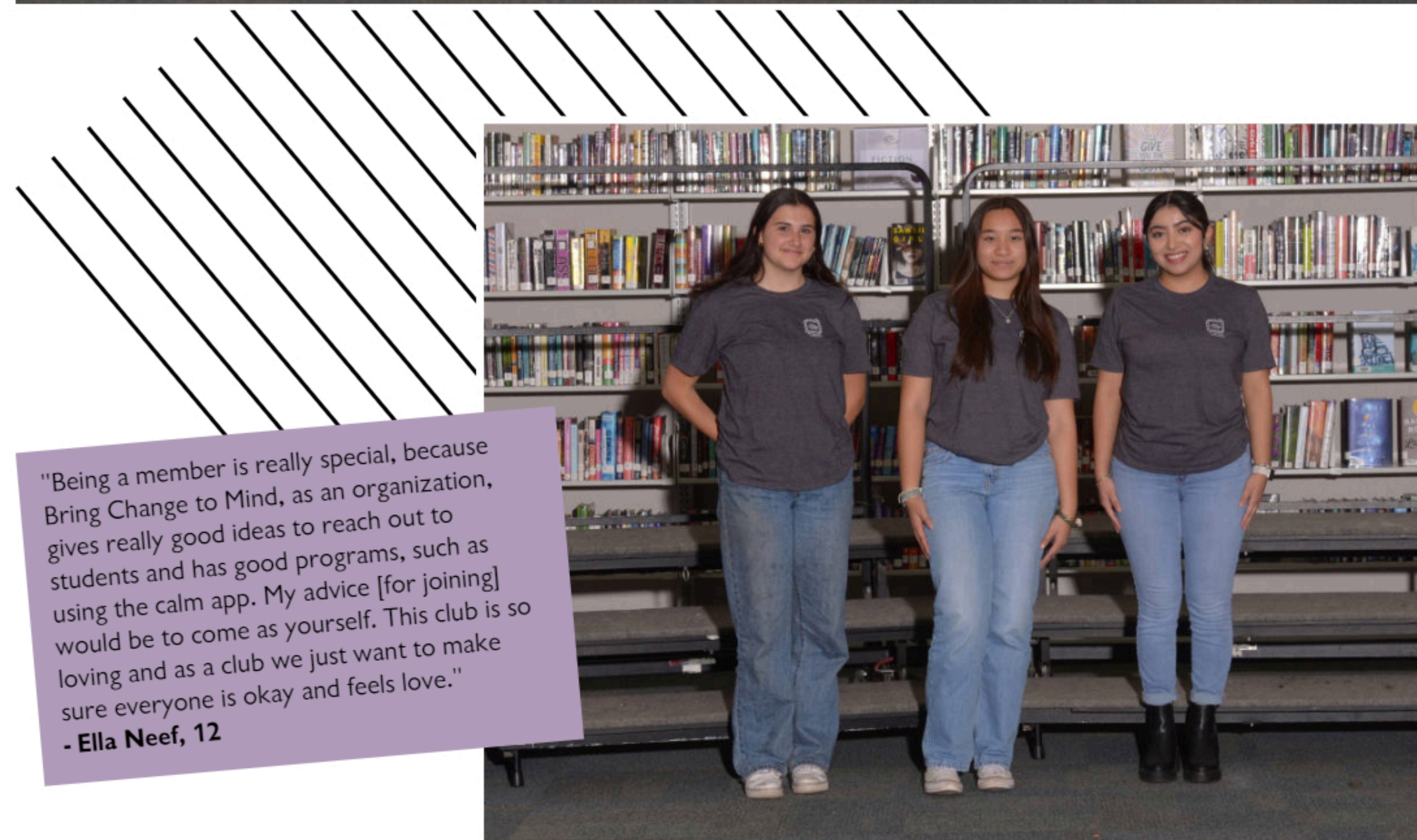
